The meeting was called to order by Judge/Executive Chris Elleman.

Opening prayer by Daryl Hodge.

Opening Pledge of Allegiance led by Chris Davis.

IN RE: PUBLIC COMMENTS

David Koob was in attendance. He said if he intends to build a house and the health department updates their restrictions before he builds, he would have to abide by the new regulations. He thinks that the participants in the solar project should have to abide by the new regulations in the solar ordinance. He mentioned a study that was done in the Winchester area that shows that solar panels negatively impact the property values in the vicinity. He also mentioned an article in Inter County magazine about developing a solar field on an ash dump. He said if we were going to do solar, then that is probably the right way to go. He thinks that by taking good farmland that our ancestors literally broke their backs on and cleared with hand implements and teams of horses deserve more respect.

IN RE: OLD BUSINESS

At the July 28, 2025, meeting, Judge/Executive Elleman stated that Daryl Day would be handling the negotiation with Atmos Energy on the price of an easement at Logan Hubble. He updated that Mr. Day negotiated the price at \$25,000 instead of \$5,000.

The fence is finished at Logan Hubble. Some playground equipment needs to be moved within the fenced-in area.

Magistrate Day said 954 did get a white stripe. He said they're getting a lot of complaints on Facebook about the mowing needed on the roadsides, which is the responsibility of the state road department.

Magistrate Barker said he witnessed a tractor trailer using the new RCUT on the north end by Rocky Top without any problem. Some people are still trying to go around the concrete and turn left out of Rogers Rd. Judge/Executive Elleman said he's asked the transportation department about putting some signage up to deter this.

IN RE: RURAL HEART AND LUNG STUDY

Babette Overman (Community Advisory Board), Stephanie Boone (Associate Professor at the University of Louisville School of Public Health & Information Sciences), and Stephie Abraham (Research Coordinator) were in attendance. They are bringing a study to Boyle and Garrard County residents. They would like to evaluate cardiovascular disease. They are going to set up a mobile exam unit at Millenium Park with a CT scanner and an echocardiogram, at no cost. They will ask a series of questions about behavioral health, screenings, and lifestyle factors. Participants in the study are voluntary, and their

information remains private. They have a target of 855 study participants from Garrard and Boyle County. They are partnering with Bluegrass Community Action to aid with transportation.

The RURAL (Risk Underlying Rural Areas Longitudinal) Heart and Lung Study aims to address critical gaps in our knowledge of heart and lung disorders in rural counties in the southeastern US. To participate in the study, a person must be between 25 – 64 years of age, be a resident of Perry, Breathitt, Boyle, or Garrard County, and must not be on active military duty. IN RE: U.S. SMALL BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION-DISASTER RECOVERY

Harold Nunez was in attendance. Kentucky suffered major flooding in April 2025. The original deadline for the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) disaster loan application was July 25, 2025. IN RE: HB 723 RESOLUTION

Montie Major and Michael Murphy were in attendance. They presented a Resolution of the Garrard County Fiscal Court authorizing the completion and filing of a Government Resources Accelerating Needed Transformation (GRANT) program of 2024 project application for up to \$82,524 in grant program of 2024 funds with the Cabinet for Economic Development (CED). This Resolution authorizes Judge/Executive Elleman to execute any documents which are deemed necessary by CED to carry out this project. It also authorizes the authorized representative to act as the authorized correspondent for this project and permits review and execution of all agreements and requests of all disbursements relating to the grant program of 2024.
